Indeed, there is rarely a "magical" moment when healing just happens — we must be proactive and put forth the effort as Christians to revitalize our lives and our churches through the power of the Holy Spirit. Story for Today

Healing Laughter

People kept coming to Jesus from all directions and Jesus healed all who came, including lepers. In no way could soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan be considered leprous, yet these catastrophically injured people are creating a class of amputees and burn victims that many do not wish to see.

One such person, who is demanding to be seen in an unpredictable way, is comedian Bobby Henline, a sergeant in the 82nd Airborne, whose face was burned off. He's had a very little cosmetic surgery, so "he's pretty shocking to look at," reported David Wood to NPR Fresh Air interviewer Terry Gross. "These guys volunteered, sacrificed, survived and their wounds, their scars, are a visible sign of their sacrifice and they want to be acknowledged; they're proud of them," said Wood, who has spent thirty-five years covering armed conflicts worldwide.

Bobby was not a religious man, but after being blown up in a Humvee with four other paratroopers who did not survive, he believed he was meant to do something. Since "he didn't like being stared at, he would often smile and make a joke in an attempt to get people to approach him as a person. Bobby was looking for a way to say, 'Come, talk to me, I'm a human being.'"

Deciding to take his humor public, he encountered an awkward initiation phase as people weren't sure how to react. Were they supposed to laugh when he joked about his last tour of duty being a "blast?" Eventually, it worked and Henline started performing standup comedy for young soldiers at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. "In about thirty seconds, those soldiers were weeping with laughter. They were just absolutely out of control."

Henline has laughed at the demons from his past and healing has taken place, for both Bobby and audiences who laugh with him. Bobby allows people to look his injury straight in the face and through their intimate interaction, they are made clean.

Before a wedding date is scheduled, arrangements must be made with one of the parish priests at least six months in advance. Weddings may be scheduled any time after 3:00 p.m. on Fridays and before 1:30 p.m. on Saturdays. Throwing of rice, birdseed, confetti, etc. is prohibited.
